



Intro

- The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is the basis of our Christian faith.
- The resurrection is why the church exists.
- Traditionally, on this Sunday, every church in the world celebrates the resurrection.
- Christ's resurrection is the turning point of human history.
- It is why we have any hope at all.
- We will look at it today through the lens of John 20.






I. The Empty Tomb John 20:1-10

- 20:10 After the sight of the empty tomb, Peter & John simply went home.
- They didn't know what else to do.
- They saw the tomb was vacant.
- In v. 8 John said that he believed.
- But believing was not really enough.
- An empty tomb alone could not substitute for their experience of the living Christ.





II. Jesus Appears to Mary Magdalene John 20:11-18

- 20:11 Mary stayed outside the tomb weeping.
- The fact of the missing body upset her.
- If she better understood what happened she would have been ecstatic, overjoyed.
- Many times our weak faith causes us to get upset at the very thing that ought to give us the most hope.
- And yet a missing body could not substitute for Mary's experience of knowing the living Jesus.



Mary and the Angels


20:12-13 Mary had a personal encounter with not one, but two angels.

Still, she kept right on weeping.

A personal encounter with angels could not substitute for Mary's personal experience of knowing Jesus Christ.

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Mary and Jesus


20:14-18 Jesus appeared to Mary.


This is the personal experience that Mary needed.

She knew Jesus before his death and now she knew that he was alive again.

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




III. Jesus Appears to the Disciples John 20:19-23


- 20:19-20 At first the disciples had the doors shut for fear of the Jews.
- But they were glad when they saw the Lord.
- Like Mary, they knew Jesus before his crucifixion.
- Now they had the personal experience they needed to know that Jesus was alive again.





IV. Jesus Appears to Thomas John 20:24-29

- 20:24-25 A number of Thomas's friends already had their personal experience with the Lord.
- But that wasn't enough for Thomas.
- Our friend's experience, our family's experience (even the experience of a many of our friends) cannot substitute for a personal encounter with the living Christ.



Jesus and Thomas


20:26-28 Jesus appeared to Thomas.

Jesus gave Thomas that personal experience he needed.

20:29 John 20:29 (ESV)
Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

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Christ's Appearances


After rising from the dead, the Lord appeared personally to only a select few of His followers and that was only for a limited time.

He then said He was going away and would send the Holy Spirit.

He said that this would be better for us than if He stayed.

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John 16:7

Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you.

Through the Person of the Holy Spirit, both God the Father and God the Son are able to be personally present with each of us at all times.

Question and Answer

Question: Why was it necessary for Jesus to go away and send the Holy Spirit?

Couldn't He have just kept right on appearing to people individually so we could all meet Him, in person, one-by-one?

Answer: No. The world is too big.

In Christ's original form he could not have appeared physically to each individual person so that they could believe in Him.

Time (Mis) Management

Time (Mis)Management

- In a 24-hour day there are 1440 minutes.
- If Christ gave each person ten minutes of His time, He could meet with 144 people in 24 hours.
- At 10 minutes per person, going non-stop 24/7 for one year, He could meet with 52,560 people.
- It would take Him 20 years to appear to everyone in Indianapolis.
- Meeting with 10 people at a time, it would take him just as long to meet with everyone in a larger city like New York.
- And at the same rate, hundreds of years to meet with everyone in the USA alone.

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
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
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V. The Reason John Wrote His Gospel John 20:30-31

- 20:30-31 John was an eyewitness to these events we have read about.
- He wrote this Gospel so that we would believe it.
- He wants us to understand that Jesus is the Christ, the Messiah, the Anointed One.
- He wants us to believe what he said about Christ rising from the dead.
- Furthermore John declares that by believing we may have life in Jesus' name.



The Heart of the Gospel

The Heart of the Gospel

- Jesus Christ died on the cross to pay the penalty for all of our sins.
- By rising from the dead Himself He has proven that He has the authority to give us eternal life.
- He wants to share that life with us.
- God wants to give you the experience of personally meeting the living Jesus.
- Through the person of the Holy Spirit He wants to enter your life right now and give you an authentic inner relationship with Him.

The Lack of Alternatives

The Lack of Alternatives

- Each of us has sinned and in so doing rebelled against God.
- God has provided the means to make us right with him through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.
- Our sin is personal.
- Therefore our receiving of forgiveness has to be personal too.
- It is not so much a question of believing the right thing, as if that were an accident.
- It is getting right with the one true God who made us and redeemed us.


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
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


The Heart of the Gospel

- In the Gospels, sometimes Jesus told people that their sins were forgiven.
- Some considered this a scandal because no one can forgive sins except God.
- And yet he did it. He claimed that authority.
- In other words, the one who we have sinned against has also paid the price for our sins.
- The one who will one day judge us is the one who is offering us a pardon.
