Something to Start Us Off

• If you had to narrow it down to one thing, what was it that made you follow Jesus?

Something to Notice

- Who did Jesus say wrote about the things that would happen to him? (v.31)
- How did the disciples react to what he said? (v.34)
- What title did the blind beggar use for Jesus? (v.38-39)

Something to Understand

See Matthew 15:21-22 and Matthew 21:8-10 for two other cases where people refer to Jesus in the same way. The significance goes back to Nathan's prophecy to David in 2 Samuel 7:12-17.

By the way, in Matthew 20:29-34, we get what seems to be the same story that we have here. Matthew, however, indicates that there were *two* blind men instead of one.

- Why do you suppose the disciples had such a hard time understanding when Jesus talked about his upcoming death and resurrection?
- According to Jesus, what role did the blind man's faith play in his healing? In what ways
 do you think that might also make a difference today?
- How did the (formerly) blind man and the people around him all respond after he was healed? Again, do you think we can learn something from their example?

Something to Take Home

- Based on our study of this section of Luke 18, how does following Jesus today compare with following him during the time of his earthly ministry?
- Is there anything else this look at Luke 18:31-43 that you especially want to remember for future reference? Can you explain why?
