



Zacchaeus Luke 19:1-10

Something to Start Us Off

- Have you ever invited yourself to someone's house or to some event? Are you willing to talk about it?

Something to Notice

- Where does this story take place? (v.1)
- What do we learn about Zacchaeus from verses 2 & 3?
- How did Zacchaeus respond to Christ taking notice of him? (vv.6-8)

Something to Understand

While Matthew, Mark and Luke all tell the story of the blind man (or men) healed at Jericho (and only Mark names him as Bartimaeus), Luke alone tells the story of Zacchaeus that takes place during the same visit.

- In the early part of the story, Zacchaeus seems excited and determined to see Jesus passing by. Luke does not tell us, but why do you suppose that is?
- Jesus invites himself to the home of Zacchaeus for dinner or maybe to spend the night as a guest. What do you think that meant to Zacchaeus personally?
- The response of Zacchaeus seems to be especially generous. If something similar were to be done by someone today, who (or what kind of person) do you think it might be?
- In what ways might evidence of repentance look different from person to person?

Something to Take Home

- Based on our study of this section of Luke 19, what relationship should repentance have to the life that someone lived before they knew Jesus?
- Is there anything else this look at Luke 19:1-10 that you especially want to remember for future reference? Can you explain why?
