


I. Greeting

2 Peter 1:1-4







The Prophetic Word Confirmed 2 Peter 1 Conclusions

1 Corinthians 3:12-15

12 Now if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw— 13 each one's work will become manifest, for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed by fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done. 14 If the work that anyone has built on the foundation survives, he will receive a reward. 15 If anyone's work is burned up, he will suffer loss, though he himself will be saved, but only as through fire.

The authors of Scripture ... did not offer their own interpretation (1:20). Rather, they spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit (1:21). Thus, the Bible is uncontaminated and completely without error in the same way that the Holy Spirit protected Jesus from sin in his conception and birth, even though it included human involvement. Thus, we can confidently say that Scripture's true author is God.
