- A very prosperous city, it was the political capital of Roman Asia.
- It was formerly the seat of one of the Hellenistic kings.
- A city with a majestic acropolis, on which were several major temples to Greek gods.

- The special home of the worship of Asclepius, a god represented by a snake.
- He was related to healing and medicine.
- Besides him, Zeus and the emperor also had temples in Pergamum.

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
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

Let's now read the whole letter.

- Sharp two-edged sword In 1:16, John saw this sword coming out of the mouth of Jesus.
- It reminds us of Eph 6:17, "the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God."
- The truth of God's word can cut through all the lies and false images that we may project or believe.

• Hebrews 4:12

For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

- Jesus understood the environment in which the church in Pergamum had to function.
- In this case it was the home of Satan's throne.
- I am not sure where that is today, and maybe Satan has more than one place he likes to make his home.

- It may also refer to the temple of Asclepius, a god connected with snakes and healing.
- Perhaps it is the altar to Zeus that we saw in the picture.
- The city was famous for specific forms of idolatry.

- And yet, this church remained faithful
- This was true even though one of their number was already killed for his faith.
- When difficulties come, we must already be ready to remain faithful.

- It is encouraging to know that Jesus knows our circumstances.
- He knows the difficulties and temptations that are associated with our personal lives
- He knows where we live and work and the things we have to deal with day to day.


- The false prophet Balaam appears in Numbers 22.
- He was hired by a king named Balak to curse the Jews before they entered the land.
- Instead, he blessed them, but the story did not end there.
- In Numbers 25 we see the Israelites drawn into sexual sin with foreign women and the worship of idols.

- It turns out this was because Balaam instructed the women of Midian to seduce the Israelites
- They enticed them into immoral behavior and the worship of their idols.
- In Numbers 31 we read that the Israelites later put Balaam to death.

- In Acts 15 it was exactly these things that the early church leaders warned the Gentile to watch out for.
- The Jewish leaders knew that converts coming out of paganism would face certain struggles.
- And of course, the same issues can affect us.

- Most of us probably know "churches" and "Christians" who do not reject sexually immoral behavior.
- Yet, God calls it sin and Jesus clearly speaks against it throughout the Bible – including here.


- Social pressure will increase upon us to allow sin, but we must not give in to it.
- The church in Pergamum was allowing this teaching to exist among its members.
- We can fall into the same trap but it is the teaching of Balaam.



The Devil ... evil as he certainly is, is no fool. Instead of merely trying to crush the church, he also launched a plan to join the church. In Pergamum and later in Thyatira, we see the servants of Satan beginning to infiltrate the ranks of the church.

- Jesus warned about this exact kind of thing in his Parable of the Weeds.
- Let's read it in Matthew 13:24-30.
- Early on it is too hard to tell one from the other.
- The full separation will not take place until the harvest.



So are there fake Christians? Yes, there are. But take note of this: it is not necessarily my job to figure out who the fakes are; it's my job to make sure that I'm not one of them.

- It is possible that this is the same thing as the teaching of Balaam.
- Several commentators think that it is.
- But Jesus seems to be making a distinction between the two when he uses the words, "So also ..."
- Robert Thomas makes a good point here.

The best conclusion is that there were two different but similar groups in this church, both of which had disobeyed the decision of the Jerusalem council in regard to idolatrous practices and fornication.

- Ephesus was told to repent and so also is Pergamum.
- Smyrna was not, but five of the seven churches in Revelation are told to repent.
- In other words, most of them had something important that needed to change.

- If we are a typical church, then we need to examine ourselves.
- Churches do not become corrupted all at once.
- It usually begins with the compromise of a few members or a few leaders who influence others.

- If the church does not repent, Jesus will confront them with the sword of his mouth his holy word.
- Staying faithful to the Scriptures will be a safeguard against false teaching and wrong behavior.

- The one who conquers is the person who stays faithful to Jesus despite the frequency or severity of trials.
- There are daily victories to be won and future rewards to be received.

- Hidden manna When the people of Israel were wandering in the wilderness, God satisfied their hunger with this miraculous "bread from heaven."
- When Jesus was tempted in the wilderness, Satan told him to change the stones into bread.
- He pointed back to that manna, quoting Moses.

Deuteronomy 8:3

So He humbled you, allowed you to hunger, and fed you with manna which you did not know nor did your fathers know, that He might make you know that man shall not live by bread alone; but man lives by every word that proceeds from the mouth of the Lord.

- A white stone
- In those days, a judge put a white stone into container to vote for an acquittal for a person on trial.
- Another ancient picture is a special white stone that was used as a "ticket" to gain entrance to a feast.

- A white stone
- Both of these pictures can apply to believers in a spiritual sense.
- We have been declared righteous we receive our acquittal – through faith in Christ.
- We are allowed entrance to feast with Christ today and will one day feast with Him in glory.

- A new name
- The word Jesus uses for "new" is not so much new in contrast to old.
- It is more like something that is new and different.
- The one who conquers will receive a name that is of superior quality.

- A new name
- It is a name personally given by Jesus Christ himself like Simon becoming Peter.
- It will reflect the believer's standing in fully belonging to Christ.

- Remember that Jesus knows your circumstances.
- He knows the details of your life.
- He knows where you live and work, and what the special temptations are that you face.

- Sexual immorality and false ideas of God are common in the history of the church.
- Any church that allows such teaching is in trouble.
- Notice in 2:14-15 that it is not (yet) the official teaching of the church.
- It is just that the church had some members who believed these false doctrines. This is how it starts.

- The way to prevent the entrance of false teaching is to stay faithful to the word of God.
- And if we are victorious, we will receive hidden manna or nourishment from Jesus.
- There will be a white stone with a special name a personal honor given by Jesus himself.

Revelation 2:7

To the one who conquers I will grant to eat of the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.

Revelation 2:11

The one who conquers will not be hurt by the second death.

Revelation 2:17

To the one who conquers I will give some of the hidden manna, and I will give him a white stone, with a new name written on the stone that no one knows except the one who receives it.
