2. Preservation – God has providentially guarded His word, so that, though written long ago, is still available to us today.

• Psalm 119:152, 160

152 Long have I known from your testimonies that you have founded them forever.

160 The sum of your word is truth, and every one of your righteous rules endures forever.

3. Inerrancy – The Bible is completely true and without error in all that it teaches and in all that it says.

• John 17:17

Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth.

4. Infallibility – The Bible will not fail to produce the desired results in all that God intends His word to do.

Isaiah 55:10-11

10 "For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven

and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout,

giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, ...

5. Clarity – The Bible – and above all its most important truths – can be adequately understood by a normal person applying due diligence to the task.

The unfolding of your words gives light; it imparts understanding to the simple.

6. Sufficiency – The Bible is enough.

Deuteronomy 8:3

And he humbled you and let you hunger and fed you with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, that he might make you know that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord.

I. The Beginning of Creation

1:1-2

- 1:1 In Hebrew there are 7 words and 28 letters.
- Beginning with the last letter of the first word, every 50th letter spells Torah.
- The same thing happens in Exodus
- God = Elohim a plural form, appears 35 times in this section.


- 1:1 God created = *bara* = something only He can do.
- The traditional understanding of creation is that it is creation ex nihilo, from nothing.
- It is kind of like a Big Bang, except that the Bible tells us who made it all go boom.



The Hebrew word bara is a word that is used only of God and only of the work that only God can do. It is never used with anything that man does. There are several words in the Hebrew Bible that are used only of God, and this is one of them.





Colossians 1:15-17

15 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. 16 For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. 17 And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together.

Hebrews 11:3

By faith we understand that the universe was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things that are visible. II. Forming: Days 1-3

1:3-13

- The Second Day 1:6-8
- The waters are separated by an expanse called Heaven, or "the sky."

II. Forming: Days 1 – 3

1:3-13

- The Third Day 1:9-13
- 1:9-10 Water and Land are now separated.
- 1:11-13 Plants begin to appear, growing out of the earth.
- According to its kind Plants and (later) animals are created with certain genetic boundaries.

1:14-31

 Note the matching of this set of three days to the previous set.

- The Fourth Day 1:14-19
- Now the sun, the moon and the stars are all created.
- Before this, there was light, but God must have been the source of it.

1:14-31

Revelation 21:23

And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and its lamp is the Lamb.

1:14-31

Revelation 22:25

And night will be no more. They will need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

- The Fifth Day 1:20-23
- 1:21 Again bara is the word used for created.
- God fills the water and the sky with living creatures.
- Notice again, they are created according to their kinds.

- The Sixth Day 1:24-31
- 1:24-25 God makes a distinction between livestock and all the wild animals.
- 1:26 man = *adam*
- Image, likeness This is what separates us from all the other creatures God has made.

- The Sixth Day 1:24-31
- 1:27 God created man
- The word bara is used 3x in this verse.
- He creates them male and female.

- The Sixth Day 1:24-31
- 1:28-31 God rules over the universe, but He intended humanity to rule over the earth and all that is in it.
- Humans and animals were originally all vegetarian.

Ramifications of Being Made in God's Image:

- We can relate to God on a personal level.
- God can communicate to us and vice versa.
- Jesus could become a man.
- We, something like God, can be creative.
- We can express ourselves and communicate with one another even at a high level.

• Even after the Fall and after the Flood, the image of God in us is still there.

1:14-31

- God said to Noah,
- Genesis 9:6

Whoever sheds the blood of man, by man shall his blood be shed, for God made man in his own image.

IV. The Seventh Day

2:1-3

- 2:2 And he rested
- The root word for rested is shabat.
- The primary sense is to stop or cease from something.
- God stopped his work of creating the heavens and the earth.

The Creation Story Genesis 1:1 – 2:3

- God made all things, so He is the ultimate ruler.
- God created us in His own image, so we are responsible to Him.
- The marriage of male and female (one man, one woman, one lifetime) is part of God's plan.
- God made us the rulers of His creation, so it is ours to enjoy, but also to govern as stewards.


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- Christians differ on the timing and method of creation.
- Still, the text itself only allows so much wiggle room.
- Norman Geisler identified five points that define a Christian understanding of the Genesis account.

- (1) There is a theistic God.
- (2) Creation of the universe is ex nihilo (out of nothing).
- (3) Every living thing was created by God.
