Something to Notice

Let's dive into the details of Acts 24—notice the people, places, and actions that drive this chapter!

- Who accuses Paul and what charges do they bring in Acts 24:1-9?
- How does Paul open his speech in Acts 24:10-13?
- What does Paul say about his faith in Acts 24:14-16?
- Paul makes several points in his defense in Acts 24:17-21. What are they?
- What do we learn about Paul's further interactions with Felix in Acts 24:22-27?

Something to Learn

Key Insights:

* Acts 24 reveals Paul's clear conscience in trial; Felix kept him imprisoned two years as a political favor – well, and maybe to get some money.

Discussion Questions:

- How would you describe the strategy of Tertullus at the beginning of the chapter?
- By way of contrast, how would you describe the strategy of Paul?
- While it doesn't say this directly, what do you think went through Paul's mind during all this time before Roman officials, in custody, and waiting for an outcome?
- What would you say this section reveals about the character of Felix?

Something to Take Home

- Let's look at Paul as a positive example in this chapter. What is something we can learn from him?
- On the other hand, both the Jewish and Roman leaders that we see show us examples of the kind of behavior we should avoid. What can we (negatively) learn from them?
