

- Contributions begin to come in and work on the tent structure begins.
- Eventually Moses will have to put a stop on the contributions as the people gave more than enough.

I. Sabbath Rules

35:1-3

- Remembering the Sabbath was on the short list of things God mentioned to Moses on the mountain.
- That was in 34:21.

- That is exactly why God needed to remind them to keep the Sabbath holy.

35:4-29

- 35:5 God commanded Moses to collect this offering from the people.
- Still, God specifies that he wants it to be from those with a generous heart.

II. The Contributions

35:4-29

- 2 Corinthians 9:7

Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

II. The Contributions

- God wants us to give, but the attitude we have behind our giving is also important.
- We'll talk more about giving later – especially at the end of the study.

- 35:30 – 36:2 Two of my favorite characters in these chapters of Exodus are Bezalel and Oholiab.
- We are told that the Spirit of God put the skills needed for the work within them.
- God also enabled them to teach others to share in their work.

III. Bezalel and Oholiab

35:30 – 36:7

- 35:30 – 36:2 When we think of spiritual gifts, we may think of prophecy or tongues or teaching.
- We should not only look at the New Testament – for example, in 1 Corinthians 12 and 14.
- Spiritual gifts start here in Exodus with Bezalel and Oholiab who were gifted craftsmen.

III. Bezalel and Oholiab

35:30 – 36:7

- 36:3-7 Look at this amazing response!
- It is easy to look at all that the Israelites do wrong on their way to the Promised Land.
- This is one thing they did right.
- They gave generously.

III. Bezalel and Oholiab

35:30 – 36:7

When the heart is truly stirred, and the spirit makes willing, giving is robbed of all meanness; indeed, it ceases to be calculating. Nothing is too precious to be given, no amount is too great.

- Maybe the big lesson here is that God sees our work.
- He knows what we do for Him and how well we do it.
- He sees it in every detail.

- Colossians 3:23-24

23 Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, 24 knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ.
