
What to expect in Exodus 37 – 38:

- We will look at them one at a time.

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



I. The Ark

37:1-9


- The ark of the covenant was the holiest item of all.
- It belonged in the holiest place of all – the holy of holies – *Kodesh HaKodashim*
- That is a Hebrew way of saying the most holy place.



I. The Ark

37:1-9

- Once the tabernacle was built, and later the temple, the high priest would enter this place once a year.
- That was on *Yom Kippur*, the Day of Atonement.
- And he would apply blood to the cover – mercy seat – of the ark.




I. The Ark

37:1-9

- Leviticus 16:14-15

14 And he shall take some of the blood of the bull and sprinkle it with his finger on the front of the mercy seat on the east side, and in front of the mercy seat he shall sprinkle some of the blood with his finger seven times ...




I. The Ark

37:1-9

- Leviticus 16:14-15

... 15 "Then he shall kill the goat of the sin offering that is for the people and bring its blood inside the veil and do with its blood as he did with the blood of the bull, sprinkling it over the mercy seat and in front of the mercy seat.

- The table would be used to hold the bread that was constantly on display inside the tabernacle.
- This is the first of three items of furniture that we find in the Holy Place – outside the Holy of Holies.

II. The Table

37:10-16



- John 6:47-51

47 Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. 48 I am the bread of life. 49 Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. 50 This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die ...

- John 6:47-51

... 51 I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.

III. The Lampstand

37:17-24



III. The Lampstand

37:17-24

- The lampstand – *menorah* – was the next item of furniture.
- It served a very obvious purpose of providing light inside the tent which had no windows.



III. The Lampstand

37:17-24

- John 8:12

Again Jesus spoke to them, saying,
"I am the light of the world.
Whoever follows me will not walk in
darkness, but will have the light of
life."



III. The Lampstand

37:17-24

- John 9:5

As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.



III. The Lampstand

37:17-24

- 1 John 1:5-7

5 This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. 6 If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth ...



III. The Lampstand

37:17-24

- 1 John 1:5-7

... 7 But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.

IV. The Altar of Incense

37:25-29

- One of Aaron's jobs was to burn incense on this altar every morning and every evening.
- In the Bible, incense is symbolic of prayer.

IV. The Altar of Incense

- Psalm 141:2


Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, and the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice!

V. The Bronze Altar and Basin

V. The Bronze Altar and Basin

- These two items were located outside the tent.
- The basin held water for the priests to wash with.
- The large bronze altar was the place where the animal sacrifices were offered.

38:9-20

- There was a cloth fence that went all around the tent and enclosed the entire area.
- This really just acted as a boundary.
- All the activities connected with worship took place inside the court.
- Only the priests were then allowed inside the tent.

VII. The Materials Used

38:21-31

VII. The Materials Used

38:21-31

- 38:24 This is about 2200 lbs. of gold.
- 38:25 This is about 6650 lbs. of silver.
- 38:29 This is about 5250 lbs. of bronze
- As of yesterday, gold was priced at \$4980.40 / oz.
- That makes the gold worth \$175 million.
- The silver as of yesterday would be \$8.35 million.




Faithfulness in All We Do
