



## More Than Conquerors

## Romans 8:31-39

### Something to Start Us Off

- When have you felt completely safe, protected, and loved — like nothing could touch you? What gave you that sense of security?

### Something to Notice

Let's read Romans 8:31-39 slowly and mark the powerful truths that give us confidence in Christ. Here are some that might stand out to us.

- 8:31 *If God is for us, who can be against us?*
- 8:32 *He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all...*
- 8:33 *Who shall bring any charge against God's elect?*
- 8:34 *Who is to condemn?*
- 8:37 *In all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.*
- 8:38-39 *[Nothing] ... will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus*

### Something to Learn

#### **Key Insights:**

\* This final section is Romans 8's victory lap. After the struggle of chapter 7 and the great truths of chapter 8, Paul celebrates the absolute security we have in Christ.

#### **Discussion Questions:**

- Paul asks, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (v. 31). How does this truth change the way we face opposition or fear?
- Verse 32 says God "did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all." How does the cross prove that God is truly "for us"?
- What is the difference between being a "conqueror" and being "more than conquerors" (v. 37)?
- Looking at the long list in vv. 38–39, which of these things most often makes you feel separated from God's love? How does this passage speak to that fear?
- How can the truths in this passage help us encourage someone who is currently going through deep suffering or doubt?

### Something to Take Home

- Memorize and/or meditate on Romans 8:38–39 this week. When you face hardship, fear, or feelings of condemnation, remind yourself: "God is for me." Because He gave His Son, He will freely give us all things.
